	everyone for attending. ASM explained the role of the	
	parents and recognised the key role they play in their child's	
	education. ASM acknowledged that everyone in attendance	
	in the meeting has the common aim to make Saints and	
	Scholars the best that it can be and to bring about whole	
	school improvements to get the best out of our children.	
	ASM explained the vision for increasing parental involvement

	- Directory of Parents: creation of a network of willing

	forum of parents which would meet termly to bring	
	issues pertinent to their classes and support in the

## 5. Vacancies on the Board of Governors

ASM outlined the structure of the Board of Governors:

- -6 foundation governors: we have three vacancies.
- -4 department representatives: we have two vacancies.
- 2 teacher representatives.
- 4 parent representatives.

The plan to get a full complement of governors is to move three current parent representatives into the vacant 'foundation governor' positions. This would create three vacant parent governors. ASM explained that the department governors are ratified and selected by the Department of Education and this hasn't been able to take place in the absence of an Education Minister.

ASM explained the skillset of the current governors and stated that the new parent governors could have expertise in the following fields to have a set of governors with a wide range of skills:

- 1. Public relations
- 2. Community relations
- 3. Law
